



USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN THE UNION

Our Union uses artificial intelligence tools to improve efficiency and support the processing of information. The use of AI is based on careful consideration, professional expertise and responsibility. AI does not replace expert work or legal assessment; rather, it serves as a supporting tool in preparation and information retrieval. Information generated by AI is always reviewed by a human.

We only use a secure AI solution intended for organisational use (Microsoft Copilot), the use of which meets applicable information security and data protection requirements. We do not use open AI services.

In the processing of personal data, we comply with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and other applicable data protection legislation. Personal data, confidential client information and other information subject to confidentiality must not be entered into open AI services. Personal data is processed in accordance with the requirements of applicable legislation. The principles of data minimisation and purpose limitation are observed in all our activities. Content generated by AI is always critically assessed before it is used. Responsibility for the final outcome always remains with a human.

The Union monitors developments and regulations relating to AI and updates its guidelines when necessary. Our aim is to make responsible and controlled use of new technologies while ensuring that the rights, data protection and confidentiality of our members are safeguarded in all circumstances.
